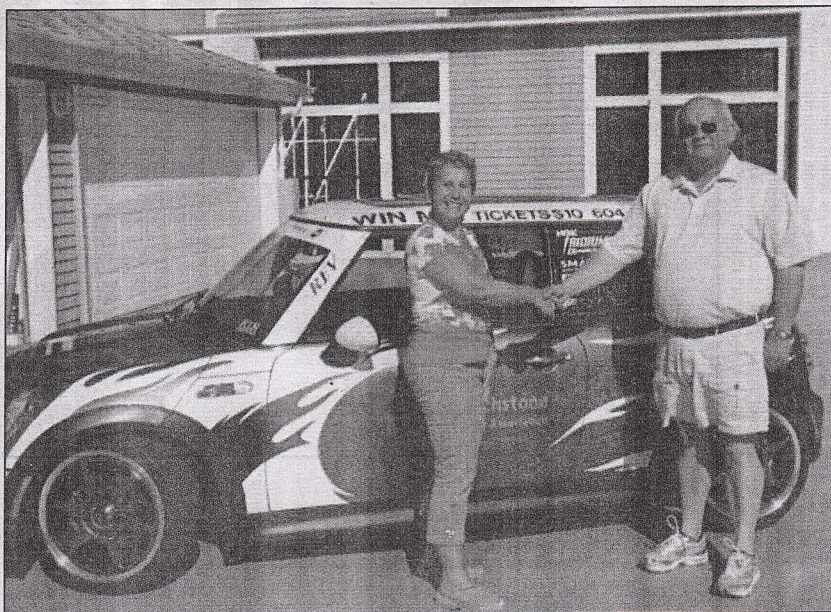
Mini Cooper draw helps fund Touchstone programs
